
## Hu's Pledge to Castro: China Will Firmly Support Cuba's Socialist Cause

Praising Castro as the leader of the Cuban socialist revolution, Hu hailed the fearless struggle by the heroic Cuban people to safeguard state sovereignty and adhere to the path of socialism.

Hu said that the Chinese people will support the just struggle of the Cuban people in safeguarding state sovereignty and opposing outside interference. In practice, when the covers of diplomatic language are stripped away, this means a pledge to defend socialistic Cuba against U.S. imperialist attack.
